### 8.1 LE PACTE BROME-MISSISQUOI

Le Pacte Brome-Missisquoi notified the municipality that they have decided to not call for projects this fall but rather to postpone to a later date.

The Brome-Missisquoi Pacte has supported numerous projects, notably in the leisure, culture, environmental and bio-food sectors.

Brome-Missisquoi's challenges have evolved in recent years, and some have become more acute since the pandemic, such as access to housing and property, the capacity to accommodate new populations, accessibility to social services, labour shortages and the frequency of more extreme climatic events.

The elected representatives wish to take advantage of the regional strategic planning update to take a step back and ensure that this investment fund responds to the priorities that will be identified over the coming months. This time for reflection will also enable us to review the mechanism for allocating funds and the evaluation process.

# 8.2 REQUEST FOR SUPPORT – TOURS DES ARTS 2024 Resolution 2023-260

The Tour des Arts 2024 has submitted to the members of the municipal council a request for financial support in the sum of \$200, in order to obtain one or many subsidies notably from the Canadian Heritage Program;

TO donate \$200 to the Tour des Arts 2024 and support their application for other grant and subsidy programs available to them;

### 8.5 2019-2024 FUEL TAX PROGRAM (TECQ) Resolution 2023-262

WHEREAS the municipality has taken cognizance of the guide to the terms and conditions of payment of the government contribution under the Fuel Tax Program (TECQ) and Quebec's Contribution for the years 2019 to 2024;

WHEREAS the municipality must comply with the terms and conditions of this guide that apply to it, to receive the government contribution confirmed. The government contribution was confirmed in a letter from the Ministère des Affaires Municipales et de l'Habitation;

### IT IS RESOLVED THAT

The municipality undertakes to comply with the terms and conditions of the guide that apply to it;

The municipality agrees to be solely responsible for and to hold harmless the Government of Canada and the Government of Quebec, as well as their ministers, senior officials, employees and agents from any and all liability for claims, demands, losses, damages and costs of any kind arising out of any injury to or death of any person, damage to property or loss of property attributable to any willful or negligent act arising directly or indirectly from investments made with financial assistance obtained under the TECQ 2019-2024 program;

The municipality approves the content and authorizes the sending to the Ministère des Affaires Municipales et de l'Habitation the program of work no 02 and all other documents required by the Minister in order to receive the government contribution confirmed in a letter from the Ministère des Affaires Municipales et de l'Habitation;

The municipality undertakes to meet the minimum capital expenditure threshold imposed on it for all five years of the program;

The municipality undertakes to inform the Ministère des Affaires Municipales et de l'Habitation of any changes to the program of work approved by this resolution;

WHEREAS Moved by Wesley Patch Seconded by Larry Royea AND RESOLVED THAT The municipality hereby certifies that the attached program of work no. 02 contains true costs realized.

#### 8.6 RENEWAL OF THE FUEL TAX PROGRAM (TECQ) AND THE CONTRIBUTION FROM QUEBEC 2024-2028 Resolution 2023-263

WHEREAS the governments of Québec and Canada are currently negotiating for the renewal of the Fuel Tax Program (TECQ) and Quebec's contribution for the period 2024-2028;

WHEREAS this program is essential to the realization of important projects in communities in Quebec;

WHEREAS despite the substantial sums allocated to this program, they remain insufficient to meet needs, and must be substantially increased due to rising project costs of carrying out projects;

WHEREAS on August 24, 2023, the Board of Directors of the Fédération Québécoise des Municipalités (FQM) asked the governments of Quebec and Canada to reach an early agreement to ensure the renewal of this important program;

WHEREAS the Federation of Canadian Municipalities has asked the Federal government to to double its investment in this program and to provide for an indexation of 3.5% per year;

WHEREAS the FQM and its members have been requesting for several years that the Fuel Tax Program (TECQ) and Quebec's contribution be used to finance and implement projects planned and decided by Quebec municipalities, in the sense that municipal building projects (garages, town halls, fire stations, etc.) and work on retention structures (dams, etc.) are eligible for this program;

WHEREAS it is important to adapt programs to the challenges posed by climate change and to enable municipalities to finance development and adaptation work to the consequences of these changes, such as the creation of firebreaks to protect forest communities;

WHEREAS the reporting requirements for projects are time consuming for municipalities;

WHEREAS it is imperative that negotiations be concluded by early fall 2O23 to ensure its implementation on January 1, 2024, and to enable municipalities to plan investments in their budgets;

WHEREAS the sums allocated to this program must be exempt from any new obligations or conditions to ensure its success;

THEREFORE Moved by Wesley Patch Seconded by Michael Allnutt AND RESOLVED

THAT the FQM ask the governments of Quebec and Canada:

TO conclude a new federal-provincial agreement for the renewal of the Fuel Tax Program (TECQ) and Quebec's contribution for the period January 1, 2024, to December 31, 2028;

TO increase the sums available to Quebec municipalities, and to provide for an annual increase in the envelope for the duration of the agreement to cover rising costs;

TO not add any additional accountability, obligations, or conditions to the municipalities in the application of the program;

TO allow the financing of municipal building projects, retention works and wharves owned by municipalities in eligible work;

TO make eligible projects involving prevention, development and adaptation to the consequences of climate change;

TO TRANSMIT a copy of this resolution to the Quebec Minister of Finance, Mr. Eric Girard, the Quebec Minister of Municipal Affairs, Ms. Andrée Laforest, the Deputy Premier and and Minister of Finance of Canada, the Honourable Chrystia Freeland, the Minister of Housing the Honourable Sean Fraser and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. Federation of Canadian Municipalities;

THAT this resolution be sent to all FQM members for adoption and transmission stakeholders concerned.

#### 8.7 NEXT GENERATION 9-1-1 AUTHORITY SERVICE AGREEMENT Resolution 2023-264

WHEREAS Next Generation 9-1-1 Service is a service that replaces Enhanced 9-1-1 service and is based on Internet Protocol technologies and supports 9-1-1 Calls natively end-to-end;

WHEREAS in June 2017, the CRTC rendered Telecom Regulatory Policy CRTC 2017-182, which, among other things, directed all Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers to establish Next Generation 9-1-1 networks by 9-1-1 network service providers;

WHEREAS Bell operates and manages a Next Generation 9-1-1 System serving the provinces where it is the Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers and where requested by a Small Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier to operate as the Small Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier New Generation 9-1-1 network provider, including in the territory in which the 9-1-1 Authority operates;

THAT Permaroute will complete the work for a cost of \$7,140 plus transport and applicable taxes;

#### 8.9 AWARDING OF CONTRACT – SKATING RINK CONTRACT 2023-2024 Resolution 2023-266

WHEREAS Jean Benoit maintained the skating rink at Heritage Park for the past winter seasons;

WHEREAS an offer of service for the maintenance of the skating rink and the park for the 2023-2024 winter season was received;

THEREFORE Moved by Wesley Patch Seconded by Larry Royea

- To hire Jean Benoit to maintain the skating rink for the winter season 2023-2024 at a cost of \$5,780 paid in four equal monthly instalments starting December 2023. It has been stated to Mr. Benoit that \$5,780 is conditional on whether the new four-season skating rink is installed for the 2023-2024 season.
- To finance this expense, net of tax rebates, from the general fund and confirm that the necessary credits will be provided in the 2024 budget.
- To authorize the Director General and Clerk-Treasurer to give all necessary instructions and to sign all documents to this effect.

### 8.10 GARBAGE CLEAN UP AT 322 STAGECOACH Resolution 2023-267

CONSIDERING that the tenants of 322 Stagecoach left a significant amount of garbage around and on the property when they moved September 30<sup>th</sup>;

TO authorize the Director General and Clerk-Treasurer to find and hire a contractor that will be responsible for cleanup and waste/garbage disposal. The contractor will be responsible for taking the garbage to the dump site. The maximum budget is \$8,000 before taxes.

5. It was asked if there have been any changes concerning the house that is beside the house that burnt.

**ANSWER:** Gail explained that the house has been sold and the new owners plan to renovate.

6. It was asked if the TECQ money must be spent on the roads.

**ANSWER:** The mayor explained that the first priorities are water and sewar networks and then the roads. Brome Village is fortunate that we don't have those infrastructures so we can spend the complete amount on the roads.

7. It was asked about the December 2023 deadline concerning the TECQ.

**ANSWER:** The mayor explained that when the original request was submitted to the TECQ it was for roads and the new building at 322 Stagecoach. Now we will be using another Provicial government grant for the new building called the PRACIM.
